How to Qualify

To qualify for our **New High School Graduate Bursary**, a student must have graduated from a high school in Canada and meet all CD-ED's entrance requirements. The student must complete our New High School Graduate Bursary Application (available from our Admissions Department). Furthermore, the student must start a CD-ED diploma program within one year of earning their high school diploma. CD-ED will apply the bursary as a tuition credit.
